

#### **Annexure III: Best Practices**

#### Practice -I

Title of Practice: Instalments for college fees

#### Goals:

- (1) To bring economically backward students in education stream.
- (2) To encourage poor students to continue education.

**The context:** This scheme was introduced with the sole objective that education cannot be stopped due to lack financial support. Most of the students from economically backwards are unable to pay admission fees of college so that they will be away from educational canal. To bring them in again back to education we have implemented this scheme.

The Practice: The needs of students are received in the following manner.

The college gets information from poor students or student approach to college with their problem about fees. Then ask them to write formal application to Principal for demanding the instalment in their fees. The principal allows the student if he is needy on to pay fees in instalments.

**Evidence of Success:** The college has taken a large number of initiatives for benefitting poor students. This year

- (1) In B.Sc. I Biotech 22 students, B.Sc. II 23 students and in B.Sc. III 27students gets benefit of fees instalment.
- (2) In M.Sc. I Biotech 22 students, M.Sc. II 05 students gets benefit of fees instalment.
- (3) In B.Com. I 09 students, B.Com. II 05 students and in B.Com. III 02students get benefit of fees instalment.
- (4) In B.A. II6 students, B.A. II 01 student and in B.A. III 01 student gets benefit of fees instalment.

**Resources Required:**Management permission to allow instalment in fees. The college seed money to be used for various purposes until complete fees collected from students.

#### **Obstacles faced/Problems encountered:**

Students should be reminded repetitively to pay their instalments on time. As some students unable to repay the next instalment on time, sometimes college will suffer from insufficient fund required for smooth functioning in college. So college requires mobilizing their funds from different account heading for temporary basis.

#### Practice -II

Title of Practice: Haemoglobin (Hb) check-up camp for girls

#### Goals:

- (1) To eradicate anaemia, a common condition in females.
- (2) To make aware about health in girl students.

The context: This practice was introduced with the sole objective that haemoglobin content in girls is most of time is less and which can often leads to anaemia. After puberty, girls are at more risk of iron deficiency anaemia than guys are. So to prevent anaemia condition it is necessity to know the haemoglobin content in girls. So we aimed to check Hb of girls in college and if necessary provide medical assistance to increase Hb content.

#### **The Practice:** The practice done in the following manner.

On the occasion of Birth Anniversary of our college founder Late. Shri. V. G. Shivdare, college organized various activities in college. One of the activities is Hb check-up camp in college campus in month of August every year.

The notice is displayed on notice board about check-up camp well in advance. One the day of event the Hb of girls is checked. The partner to check Hb is Family Planning Association of India, Solapur Branch. Then after finalizing Hb check-up girls are informed about their Hb content. Some of the girls with low Hb are intimated with their parents to take measures to increase Hb content. College also provides Doctors help to guide our students with same problem.

Evidence of Success: The college has taken a good initiatives regarding health of girl students. This year

- (1) A total of 319 number of girl along with ladies staff students get check-up for Hb content.
- (2) Out of these 106 girls are from our V. G. shivdare College and remaining from our sisterly institutes
- (3) The college prepared the diet plan for those girls to increase Hb content with the help of local consult doctor.

**Resources Required:**To carry out this practise we require the facility to check Hb content such as hemoglobinometer and trained person to check Hb. We require consult a doctor to advice diet plant for girls with low Hb content.

#### **Obstacles faced/Problems encountered:**

Some of the time the girls fear to check-up, so need the good counselling for them to make ready for test. Awareness about Hb content and anaemia is less in college girls. So responsibility is given to ladies staff to make aware the girl student about it.
